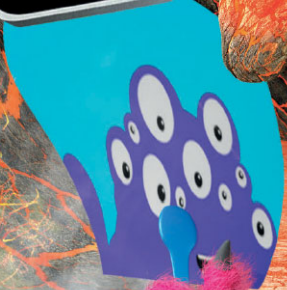

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Reading Monster is a four-level series of reading comprehension books. This series is designed for EFL learners ranging from pre-elementary school through elementary school. It guides students to expand their general knowledge and improve their reading skills through theme-based fiction and non-fiction passages and captivating pictures and images. Special efforts have been made to adjust the difficulty so that the gap between each level is almost equal.



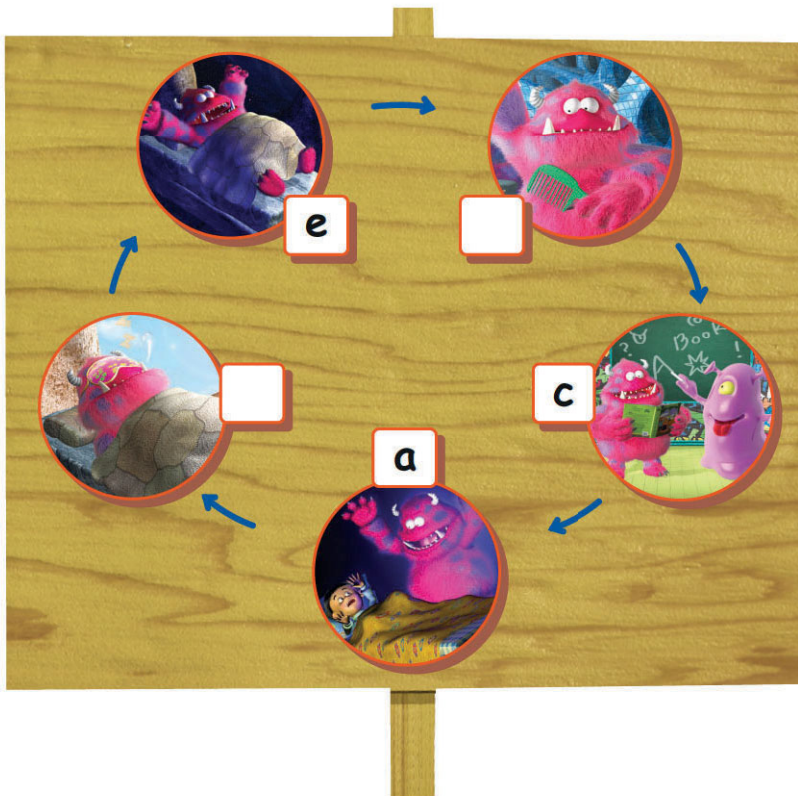
